Art Activity 1



Activity: Draw and add colours, patterns and details to flowers.

Step 1: Draw an outline of some flowers.


Step 2: Fill the flowers you have drawn with patterns of different shapes you would find in plants. See the above example to support you and try to come up with some different patterns too!

Step 3: Colour your flowers.

Step 4: Now choose your favourite flower or leaf and sketch. Try shading to create effect (look at the examples below to help you).



Art Activity 2



Activity: Draw a selection of fruit and then experiment with colouring them using different materials.

Step 1: Draw a selection of your chosen fruit.

Step 2: Use a range of materials to colour the fruit you have drawn; you could use pencils, felt tips, oil pastels, water colours, chalk or you could try a natural dye. For example a wedge of beetroot, a squashed berry or some other fruit or vegetable you would like to try. You could include an adult to work with you and have fun together!



Step 4: Add depth to your drawings by drawing on the different patterns you can see on your chosen fruit (spots, cross hatch etc) and shade with the flat of your pencil lead.

Step 5: Halve your favourite fruit and sketch. You can colour it with your favourite medium and add depth to the drawing.



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Art Activity 3

Activity: Draw a Y shaped tree.

Here is an example of the steps taken to draw a Y shaped tree.



Use the above steps to draw the tree and add some leaves to it using oil pastels. If you don't have this at home, you can use colouring pencils or felt tips. Make sure you try different shades of green. When you go out for a walk, look at the different shades of green that can be found on the leaves of trees and use this to help you select the correct shades.

Art Activity 4

Activity: Draw different stages of a plant.

Step 1: Use a pencil to sketch a seed sprout through its different stages. Then label where the seed, root, shoot and leaf are on your drawing.

Step 2: Add colour using colouring pencils.

Step 3: **Share your art work on your blog #Sprouting seeds**

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Art Activity 6:

Activity: Leaf Printing!



1. Collect **leaves** of various shapes and sizes. ...
2. Prepare the materials. Cover your work area with a mat or with newspapers. ...
3. Take one leaf and paint it.
4. Carefully place the **leaf**, painted side down, on your paper or fabric. ...
5. Remove the **leaf**. ...
6. Make more **leaf prints**!

If you don't have paint at home, you could make leaf prints using playdough!
