

Sports Premium 2020-2021

Key indicators

- 1) The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick – starting healthy active lifestyles.
- 2) The profile of PE and Sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3) Increased confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport.
- 4) Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5) Increased participation in competitive sport.

Due to the unfortunate circumstances of COVID-19 that impacted the spring and summer terms 2020, we carried forward £3,641 into this academic year. This carried forward spending had to be spent by March 2021. Therefore our total to spend this year including the brought forward amount was £23,401.

For this academic year 2020-2021, we will be carrying over £7,749 of the funding into the 2021-2022 academic year. We have spent a total of £15,652.

In the Summer term we now have a Year 5 and Year 6 netball club, with two teams in each club. More children are beginning to be inspired to join. We have been able to run an after school netball match. • New football goals – meant that we have been able to run a year 6 tournament on the field so the children had a chance at match situations before they leave for secondary school. It has also benefitted PE and clubs.
