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<u>Nursery</u>

The children have been busy exploring our topic, "Once Upon a Time." We have learnt about different sizes and the number 3 from "Goldilocks and the 3 Bears." We used the story "The 3 Billy Goats Gruff," to explore preposition such as over the bridge, under the bridge and on and off the bridge. The children very much enjoyed taking their learning outside using the tunnels, blocks and crates to create bridges and go over and under the bridges they created.







Reception

In Reception the children have begun their Marvellous machines topic. They have been thinking about how machines work and comparing the machines that we use now to the machines that were used in the past. In order to get a better understanding of changes over time, the children had a workshop from Chertsey Museum. They learned about a range of everyday objects that were used in the past and had the opportunity to handle artefacts and take part in role play.







<u>Year 1</u>

In Year 1, the children have been exploring the book 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon. We have spent some time writing guides to Earth for any future aliens who might come. In Math's, we have been exploring 2D and 3D shape as well as making numbers within 20 and understanding the place value of the tens and ones. We have been working hard learning our songs for the Christmas Nativity and cannot wait for you to hear us sing as well as watch us dance and perform.



<u>Year 2</u>

Last week, Year 2 had a very exciting visit from Florence Nightingale. We learnt all about the struggles she went through to become a nurse and the changes she made to how hospitals look after patients. We were able to practice bandaging "soldiers" from the Crimean war. We had a great morning.





<u>Year 3</u>

In Year 3, we had the pleasure of learning all about Diwali through a dance workshop! We discovered the story behind the Hindu festival and created our own dances with the help of Hazel, our professional performer from West End in Schools. We learnt so much and really enjoyed ourselves in the process.



<u>Year 4</u>

Mexicolore Workshop

On Wednesday 2nd November, Year 4 participated in an excellent workshop run by Mexicolore! The children enjoyed learning about the weapons the Maya and Aztec people used, why they sacrificed people, the importance of cocoa in everyday life and how this was used as the currency to buy goods and food. They also learnt how to chant from one to four in Mayan and even had a chance to play the drums and wear Mayan and Aztec clothing!

Meet Our Governors



Hello, my name is Beverley Prentice and I have been a governor at The Oaktree for around 18 years. As The Hermitage and The Oaktree now share a Governing Body, I am also delighted to be getting to know The Hermitage. It is fantastic that the two schools are now working together for the benefit of the children and the staff.

We moved to Woking in 1981 and I worked in the City for around five years until we had our two daughters. The next 12 years were spent bringing up the family but when our younger daughter was about to go to senior school, I realised I had time to spare.

Having always been interested in children's reading, and with the experience of supporting our dyslexic elder daughter, I started to work for a charity which recruited people to read with children in school. I enjoyed this for several years until the charity pulled out of Woking. In the meantime a friend said The Oaktree needed governors and I came along to meet Mrs Alder. My friend famously told me that it was an easy job, you came in once a term to have a cup of tea with the Head and sat in the front row of the Christmas performance. How wrong she was!

At first I didn't enjoy the role; I didn't know anything about the school and was on the point of resigning until I offered to volunteer in school instead of working with the reading charity. This opened up a whole new world and I have now for many years been working in school one morning each week and at special events. Some of you will have seen me around the school. It is a privilege to make a difference to the children, work with the staff and get to know the parents. It also makes me a better Governor who understands the day-today life of our Schools.

As a Governor I work on the Admissions Committee, the Pay Committee, Recruitment and Exclusions and do the Health and Safety Walk and any other tasks which come along, including a memorable role one year as the rear-end of a donkey in the school panto. Several years ago I was Chair for two years and now appreciate the responsibility of the position.

Out of school I enjoy travelling, gardening, cooking, days out and the company of friends. Family life is busy with my husband now retired and two young grandchildren.

18 years ago I saw this work as an opportunity to give back but I quickly learned that actually it works both ways as I have benefited so much from being a Governor at The Oaktree and The Hermitage. Thank you for having me.

Heathy Snacks

All children in Early Years and Key Stage 1 are currently provided with a piece of fruit or vegetable by the Government to eat daily during morning playtime.

"The government recommends that we eat at least five portions of a variety of fruit and vegetables per Day. This is based on epidemiological evidence indicating an association between the consumption of more than 400g a Day of fruit and vegetables with a reduced risk of certain diet related chronic diseases, such as heart disease, stroke and some cancers."

We intend to continue to promote this Public Health England message by insisting on children in **The Hermitage** eating only fruit or vegetables during morning break time. After Easter, we will be promoting this message and monitoring mid morning snacks. Please help us to support our childrens health, by keeping all other snacks and food for lunchtime or after school.

We will no longer accept cereal bars as many of these contain nuts, or are high in sugar. Children bringing alternative snacks into school, such as crisps, fruit winders, yogurt coated fruit snacks or bars will be asked to eat them at lunchtime.



Nut free !

Can I also take this opportunity to remind all Parents that both The Oaktree and The Hermitage are nut free schools - we have many children with allergies and for this reason no nuts may be brought on site. Please refrain from Nutella in sandwiches also.
